Dear Families,

The Church marks time differently. Advent is our beginning to the new year.

It's the season when we resist the temptation to jump into Christmas, and instead reverently wait and watch with the prophets and the familiar characters who are on the scene when the curtain opens in Israel during the Roman occupation, 5 or 6 B.C.: Zechariah and Elizabeth, Mary and Joseph, Simeon, Anna... characters in the Story called by God to play a part at that electrifying moment in history. As they quietly tried, with wonder, to absorb the events that were being set in motion and be faithful to what was being shown to them, the rest of the world carried on with other things.

How will we take a step back in our families and our church for the next four weeks for our own sakes and for the sake of the children among us who, through no fault of their own, and without the adults in their lives choosing something else, are part of the mad rush through the holidays? How will we, with reverence and wonder be faithful to what has been revealed to us as a witness to a world that carries on with other things?

My prayer is that this simple guide will help us to gather each day for a time with those we love around the Light of Christ who has come into the world, the Holy One who was, and is, and is to come, and that by spending that time together in his Presence, we may also be bearers of the Light during this Advent season.

a Note on Reading and Retelling the Stories

Before you read the new story each evening, ask for a volunteer to retell the bible story from the previous evening. You can also retell the story together, encouraging young children to tell the parts they know, or in the case of very young children, simply letting them fill in missing words as you tell the story.

Children should never feel as though this is a test of some kind, or that they are *required* to participate in retelling. Let them observe you struggling to remember details or the right chronology! Help them to see that these are the stories of our faith which we treasure, and in telling and retelling them over and over we make them our own, participating not just in the telling, but in living in light of them.

When you read the new story, you could read it more than once, and ask children to imagine themselves close to a different character each time, noticing their reactions or imagining what their feelings might be.

You could encourage each person in the family to ask one question once you have finished reading. Those questions can be "I wonder questions" that may not have a clear answer. They might be very simple questions about content, or deeper questions about meaning. Being included in asking questions also helps young children to know that they are not being tested, but instead have a part to play too in the discovery of the meaning of a biblical text.

Invite the Spirit to be present and trust that he is as you come together around God's Word!

Zechariah and Elizabeth from Luke 1

Days 1 and 2 (retell this part of the story together on Day 2)

An Angel Visits Zechariah in the Temple

⁵When Herod was king of Judea, there was a priest by the name of Zechariah from the priestly group of Abijah. His wife Elizabeth was from the family of Aaron. ⁶Both of them were good people and pleased the Lord God by obeying all that he had commanded. ⁷But they did not have children. Elizabeth could not have any, and both Zechariah and Elizabeth were already old. ⁸One day Zechariah's group of priests were on duty, and he was serving God as a priest. ⁹According to the custom of the priests, he had been chosen to go into the Lord's temple that day and to burn incense, ¹⁰while the people stood outside praying. ¹¹All at once an angel from the Lord appeared to Zechariah at the right side of the altar. ¹²Zechariah was confused and afraid when he saw the angel.

¹³But the angel told him: Don't be afraid, Zechariah! God has heard your prayers. Your wife Elizabeth will have a son, and you must name him John. ¹⁴His birth will make you very happy, and many people will be glad. ¹⁵Your son will be a great servant of the Lord. He must never drink wine or beer, and the power of the Holy Spirit will be with him from the time he is born. ¹⁶John will lead many people in Israel to turn back to the Lord their God. ¹⁷He will go ahead of the Lord with the same power and spirit that Elijah had. And because of John, parents will be more thoughtful of their children. And people who now disobey God will begin to think as they ought to. That is how John will get people ready for the Lord. ¹⁸Zechariah said to the angel, "How will I know this is going to happen? My wife and I are both very old." ¹⁹The angel answered, "I am Gabriel, God's servant, and I was sent to tell you this good news. ²⁰You have not believed what I have said. So you will not be able to say a thing until all this happens. But everything will take place when it is supposed to."

²¹The crowd was waiting for Zechariah and kept wondering why he was staying so long in the temple. ²²When he did come out, he could not speak, and they knew he had seen a vision. He motioned to them with his hands, but did not say a thing.

The Birth of John the Baptist

²³When Zechariah's time of service in the temple was over, he went home. ²⁴Soon after that, his wife was expecting a baby, and for five months she did not leave the house. She said to herself, ²⁵"What the Lord has done for me will keep people from looking down on me."

⁵⁷When Elizabeth's son was born, ⁵⁸her neighbors and relatives heard how kind the Lord had been to her, and they too were glad. ⁵⁹Eight days later they did for the child what the Law of Moses commands. They were going to name him Zechariah, after his father. ⁶⁰But Elizabeth said, "No! His name is John." ⁶¹The people argued, "No one in your family has ever been named John." ⁶²So they motioned to Zechariah to find out what he wanted to name his son. ⁶³Zechariah asked for a writing tablet. Then he wrote, "His name is John." Everyone was amazed. ⁶⁴Right away, Zechariah started speaking and praising God. ⁶⁵All the neighbors were frightened because of what had happened, and everywhere in the hill country people kept talking about these things. ⁶⁶Everyone who heard about this wondered what this child would grow up to be. They knew that the Lord was with him.

Day 5 (Retell the whole story from this week and then read Zechariah's song of praise!)

Zechariah Praises the Lord

⁶⁷The Holy Spirit came upon Zechariah, and he began to speak: ⁶⁸Praise the Lord, the God of Israel! He has come to save his people. ⁶⁹Our God has given us a mighty Savior from the family of David his servant. ⁷⁰Long ago the Lord promised by the words of his holy prophets ⁷¹to save us from our enemies and from everyone who hates us. ⁷²God said he would be kind to our people and keep his sacred promise.

⁷³He told our ancestor Abraham ⁷⁴that he would rescue us from our enemies. Then we could serve him without fear, ⁷⁵by being holy and good as long as we live. ⁷⁶You, my son, will be called a prophet of God in heaven above. You will go ahead of the Lord to get everything ready for him. ⁷⁷You will tell his people that they can be saved when their sins are forgiven. ⁷⁸God's love and kindness will shine upon us like the sun that rises in the sky. ⁷⁹On us who live in the dark shadow of death this light will shine to guide us into a life of peace. ⁸⁰As John grew up, God's Spirit gave him great power. John lived in the desert until the time he was sent to the people of Israel.

Day 1

An Angel Visits Mary

²⁶One month later God sent the angel Gabriel to the town of Nazareth in Galilee ²⁷with a message for a virgin named Mary. She was engaged to Joseph from the family of King David. ²⁸The angel greeted Mary and said, "You are truly blessed! The Lord is with you." ²⁹Mary was confused by the angel's words and wondered what they meant. ³⁰Then the angel told Mary, "Don't be afraid! God is pleased with you, ³¹and you will have a son. His name will be Jesus. ³²He will be great and will be called the Son of God Most High. The Lord God will make him king, as his ancestor David was. ³³He will rule the people of Israel forever, and his kingdom will never end."

³⁴Mary asked the angel, "How can this happen? I am not married!"

³⁵The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come down to you, and God's power will come over you. So your child will be called the holy Son of God. ³⁶Your relative Elizabeth is also going to have a son, even though she is old. No one thought she could ever have a baby, but in three months she will have a son. ³⁷Nothing is impossible for God!"

³⁸Mary said, "I am the Lord's servant! Let it happen as you have said." And the angel left her.

Day 2

Mary Visits Elizabeth

³⁹A short time later Mary hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea. ⁴⁰She went into Zechariah's home, where she greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, her baby moved within her.

The Holy Spirit came upon Elizabeth. ⁴²Then in a loud voice she said to Mary:

God has blessed you more than any other woman! He has also blessed the child you will have. ⁴³Why should the mother of my Lord come to me? ⁴⁴As soon as I heard your greeting, my baby became happy and moved within me. ⁴⁵The Lord has blessed you because you believed that he will keep his promise.

Day 3

- ⁴⁶Mary said: With all my heart I praise the Lord, ⁴⁷and I am glad because of God my Savior.
- ⁴⁸He cares for me, his humble servant. From now on, all people will say God has blessed me.
- ⁴⁹God All-Powerful has done great things for me, and his name is holy.
- ⁵⁰He always shows mercy to everyone who worships him.
- ⁵¹The Lord has used his powerful arm to scatter those who are proud.
- ⁵²He drags strong rulers from their thrones and puts humble people in places of power.
- ⁵³God gives the hungry good things to eat, and sends the rich away with nothing.
- ⁵⁴He helps his servant Israel and is always merciful to his people.
- ⁵⁵The Lord made this promise to our ancestors, to Abraham and his family forever!
- ⁵⁶Mary stayed with Elizabeth about three months. Then she went back home.

Angels and Shepherds from Luke 2

Day 1

A Prophecy from the Book of Micah

- ² "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old,
 - from ancient times."
- Therefore Israel will be abandoned until the time when she who is in labor bears a son, and the rest of his brothers return to join the Israelites.
- ⁴ He will stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God. And they will live securely, for then his greatness will reach to the ends of the earth.

Day 2

Jesus is Born in Bethlehem

- ¹ In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ² (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³ And everyone went to their own town to register.
- ⁴ So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. ⁵ He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, ⁷ and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

Day 3

Angels and Shepherds

- *And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. *An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. *But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. "This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."
- ¹³ Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,
- "" "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

Day 4

Shepherds Tell the Good News

¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." ¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

Day 5

Retell the story of the Birth of Jesus.

When we retell a story, we sometimes use a simple object to pass to the person speaking. A Christmas ornament, especially an angel or the baby Jesus would work well for this retelling.

Wise Men From Far Away from Malthew 2

Day 1

A Prophecy from the Book of Isaiah, chapter 49

Even before I was born, the LORD God chose me to serve him and to lead back the people of Israel.

So the LORD has honored me and made me strong.

Now the LORD says to me, "It isn't enough for you to be merely my servant. You must do more than lead back survivors from the tribes of Israel. I have placed you here as a light for other nations; you must take my saving power to everyone on earth."

Days 2 and 3

The Wise Men Search for a King in Israel

'When Jesus was born in the village of Bethlehem in Judea, Herod was king. During this time some wise men from the east came to Jerusalem 'and said, "Where is the child born to be king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him." 'When King Herod heard about this, he was worried, and so was everyone else in Jerusalem. 'Herod brought together the chief priests and the teachers of the Law of Moses and asked them, "Where will the Messiah be born?"

They told him, "He will be born in Bethlehem, just as the prophet wrote,

'Bethlehem in the land of Judea, you are very important among the towns of Judea. From your town will come a leader, who will be like a shepherd for my people Israel.'

⁷Herod secretly called in the wise men and asked them when they had first seen the star. ⁸He told them, "Go to Bethlehem and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, let me know. I want to go and worship him too." Day 4

The Wise Men find Jesus

The wise men listened to what the king said and then left. And the star they had seen in the east went on ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. They were thrilled and excited to see the star.

"When the men went into the house and saw the child with Mary, his mother, they knelt down and worshiped him. They took out their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh and gave them to him. "Later they were warned in a dream not to return to Herod, and they went back home by another road.

"After the wise men had gone, an angel from the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up! Hurry and take the child and his mother to Egypt! Stay there until I tell you to return, because Herod is looking for the child and wants to kill him."

"That night, Joseph got up and took his wife and the child to Egypt, "where they stayed until Herod died. So the Lord's promise came true, just as the prophet had said, "I called my son out of Egypt."

Day 5

Retell the Story of the Wise Men

Christmas Eve or Christmas Day

Child: "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light!"

Reader:

On those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy; they rejoice before you as people rejoice at the harvest, as warriors rejoice when dividing the plunder. For as in the day of Midian's defeat, you have shattered the yoke that burdens them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor. Every warrior's boot used in battle and every garment rolled in blood will be destined for burning, will be fuel for the fire. *Isaiah* 9:2-5

Together (with great joy!):

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. Candle Lighter: Christ has brought us joy.

4th candle

Family: The Light of Christ has come into the world.

Candle Lighter: Christ our Light, our Hope, our Peace and our Joy, has come! Together: Thanks be to God!



A Reading from the Gospel of John

¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. ⁶ There was a man sent from God whose name was John. ⁶ He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. ⁶ He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. ⁶ The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. ¹o He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. ¹¹ He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. ¹² Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God—¹³ children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God. ¹⁴ The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.
