PREPARING YOUR TABLE CENTER

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Gather these simple supplies

- 3, 8.5x 11 pieces of felt: dark purple, light purple, white
- small squares of felt: 1 black, 1 green, 5 red
- colored felt or fabric stickers to decorate Easter side
- brown felt for the crown of thorns
- light brown felt for the cross
- 7 tea light candles

Additional supplies needed:

- extra tea lights
- white pillar candle
- fresh flowers for Easter Sunday morning

TO ASSEMBLE

1. Trim the dark purple and white felt so that they are slightly smaller than the light purple felt. Glue the three pieces together with the light purple one in the middle, which will make a border for the dark purple and white sides.
2. Glue the cross to the dark purple felt in the center, oriented to the long side.
3. Arrange the squares (or cut them into circles if you like) in a circle around the cross, beginning with the black one $\frac{1}{2}$ " or so from the bottom left corner of the cross, and ending with the green on the bottom, right corner. The black and the green will be beside each other. Glue them in place.
4. From the dark brown felt cut 40 small thorns or branches. These don't have to be uniform (a great job for preschoolers with child-scissors!) Keep these in a bag or a special box on the

table where you will use the Lenten Journey Table Center.

5. Decorate the white felt for Easter Sunday morning in a way that shows it is a great day of celebration! Use bright and joyful colors, flowers, butterflies, a gold crown, exuberant faces, trumpets use your imagination!

TO USE

1. Each evening, gather your family together to worship God. The black square or circle is for Ash Wednesday, and you will start with lighting just that one candle.
2. Each evening, choose one person in your family to lay a thorn or two down. You will be making a crown of thorns around the cross as you go through Lent.
3. Each Sunday of Lent, light an additional candle on one of the red circles until you get to the green one, which is for Palm Sunday. On that Sunday, all 7 candles will be burning.
4. During the days of Holy Week you will light one fewer candle each evening so that on Good Friday you will blow out the last red candle. On Saturday, when Jesus was in the tomb, you will not light any candles.
5. On Easter Sunday morning, turn over your mat and light a new, white pillar candle to celebrate Christ's triumph over death into life! You could also place a vase of fresh flowers on your table center.



Notes on Reading the Stories

- Before you read the new story each evening, ask for a volunteer to retell the Bible story from the previous evening, or another one you read together during the week. You can also retell the story together, encouraging young children to tell the parts they know, or in the case of very young children, simply letting them fill in words as you tell the story.
- When you read the new story, you could read it more than once, and ask children to imagine themselves close to a different character each time, noticing their reactions or imagining what their feelings might be.
- Encourage each person in the family to ask one question once you have finished reading. Those questions can be “I wonder questions” that may not have a clear answer. They might be very simple questions about content, or deeper questions about meaning.
- Invite the Spirit to be present and trust that he is as you come together around God’s Word!

These devotions are easily adaptable for younger children or teens, and certain activities may appeal more than others. The important thing is to “make room” in whatever way will help establish a love of coming together around God’s Story.

FAMILY DEVOTIONS FOR LENT

ASH WEDNESDAY through SATURDAY

Light the Candle

This week, there will be one candle on the black square. After lighting the candle, sit quietly for a few moments and invite God to be with you.

Confession

Child: Create in me a clean heart, O God.

*Family Responds: **And renew a right spirit within me.***

Sit in silence together and ask the Lord to bring to mind any ways that you have sinned. Confession may be silent or out loud, as the Spirit leads.

Choose one person to add a small branch to begin making the Crown of Thorns.

Pray Together: Dear Father, we remember that Jesus bore the pain of our sins on the cross. Thank you for the forgiveness that is ours because of what he was willing to do for us. Help us to follow him in love so that our lives may help others and our weaknesses never hinder them. We pray in his name, Jesus the Christ. Amen.

Optional : Sing a song your church is learning in Lent

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OPTIONAL: Additional Activities for this Week

Family Activity – Lenten Prayer or Scripture Chain

This week, make a Lenten Prayer Chain. You will need 40 purple slips of paper and 5 white pieces of paper (to use at the end of each week for the Sundays in Lent). Write Scripture verses on each link, or write the names of people you could pray for and then attach links in a chain using tape or a stapler. Throughout Lent, hang your chain somewhere close to where you eat breakfast. Each morning at breakfast, take off one link and read the verse or pray for the person before you begin the day's activities. I wonder how God's Word or your prayers each day will set something good in motion!

Reaching Out Activity

Make arrangements to serve together as a family at a soup kitchen or nearby charity sometime during the season of Lent. Put that date on your calendar and pray for that ministry as the day of your service approaches.

1ST WEEK of LENT

Light the Candles

After lighting two candles (the one for Ash Wednesday on the black square and the red one beside it), sit quietly for a few moments and invite God to be with you.

Confession

Child: Create in me a clean heart, O God.

Family Responds: **And renew a right spirit within me.**

Sit in silence together and ask the Lord to bring to mind any ways that you have sinned. Confession may be silent or out loud, as the Spirit leads. Choose one person to add a thorn to continue making the Crown of Thorns.

Pray Together: Dear Father, we remember that Jesus bore the pain of our sins on the cross. Thank you for the forgiveness that is ours because of what he was willing to do for us. Help us to follow him in love so that our lives may help others and our weakness never hinder them. We pray in his name, Jesus the Christ. Amen.

How does the season of Lent help us to grow as God's children? As you watch your seed grow, think about the ways God is helping you to grow and how you can cooperate with God's work.



Reaching Out Project – Set Aside Money

Are there things your family normally spends money on that you could do without this week? Put the money aside and save to give to Church of the Redeemer's Good Friday gift, or give to another charity or person in need.

2ND WEEK of LENT

Light the Candles

This week, we light three candles. After the candles are lit, watch the flames for a few moments until you feel quiet inside. Whisper a prayer to God, inviting him to join you.

Confession

Child: Create in me a clean heart, O God.

Family Responds: **And renew a right spirit within me.**

Sit in silence together and ask the Lord to bring to mind any ways that you have sinned. Confession may be silent or out loud. Choose one person to add a small thorn to continue making the Crown of Thorns.

Pray Together: Dear Father, we remember that Jesus bore the pain of our sins on the cross. Thank you for the forgiveness that is ours because of what he was willing to do for us. Help us during this season of Lent to pay attention to the ways you want us to grow and change.

Say to each person in your family, “The Peace of the Lord be with you!”

Try this simple game for a day (or a week if you are really brave!): Try to spend a whole day without using the pronouns *I* or *me*. Give each person 5 safety pins. Make a chain with them and pin them to your shirt. If you hear another person say *I* or *me*, you can ask them for a pin. The person with the most pins at the end of the day wins! This little game can call attention to how much we think about ourselves.

(It's not too late to make your paper chain if you haven't already. Just start with the page for this week. Take off one link each morning at breakfast and ask Jesus to help you remember those words that day.)

Reaching Out Project – Food for Others

Have you ever skipped a meal or a snack on purpose?

Christians for centuries have fasted to make room for prayer in their lives. Whether you decide to fast from food sometime this week or not, you could still find a way to provide food for those in need in our city. Maybe you purchase a grocery gift card for a family who could use it? Or make dinner for someone having a hard week?

3RD WEEK of LENT

Light the Candles

This week, we light four candles. After the candles are lit, watch the flames for a few moments until you feel quiet inside. Whisper a prayer to God to be with you.

Confession

Child: Create in me a clean heart, O God.

Family Responds: **And renew a right spirit within me.**

Sit in silence together and ask the Lord to bring to mind any ways that you have sinned. Confession may be silent or out loud. Choose one person to add a small thorn to continue making the Crown of Thorns.

Pray Together: Dear Father, we remember that Jesus bore the pain of our sins on the cross. Thank-you for the forgiveness that is ours because of what he was willing to do for us. Help us to obey him willingly.

Say to each person, “The Peace of the Lord be with you!”

Soap Cross

– from [*Before and After Easter*](#) by Debbie Trafton O'Neal

You can carve a cross from a bar of soft soap. Draw a cross with a pencil on the soap and carefully shave away the corners. (Don't try to cut the section out all at once). Use the soap during Lent to remind you that Jesus washes away all our sins. When you use your soap, remember to thank him for forgiving us.

Honoring Godparents or Mentors

Did you know that long ago the season of Lent was a time for people who wanted to become Christians to prepare for their baptism at the Easter Vigil? If you have godparents, they made a promise to pray for you at your baptism. You could pray for them this week! Do they live close to you? Ask your parents if you could host them for a meal during Lent. If your godparents don't live in our city, you could make them an Easter card and have it ready to send in time for Easter Sunday. If you haven't been baptized yet, or don't have godparents, think of someone who loves you and prays for you.

Reaching Out Project - Mercy Bags

Make a "Mercy Bag" to carry in your car and give out to people experiencing homelessness. Here are some items you could include in your Mercy Bags: toothbrush and toothpaste, granola bars, nourishing snacks, water bottle, warm socks, a note of encouragement.

4TH WEEK of LENT

Light the Candles

This week, light five candles. Once the candles are lit, you could join hands and simply sit in silence for a few moments, listening. Ask God to be with you.

Confession

Child: Create in me a clean heart, O God.

*Family Responds: **And renew a right spirit within me.***

Sit in silence together and ask the Lord to bring to mind any ways that you have sinned. Confession may be silent or out loud.

Choose one person to add a small thorn to continue making the Crown of Thorns.

Pray Together: Dear Father, we remember that Jesus bore the pain of our sins on the cross. Thank you for the forgiveness that is ours because of what he was willing to do for us.

Say to each person in your family, "The Peace of the Lord be with you!"

What a wonderful feeling of peace that brings- just as looking at a clean and tidy room, free of stuff we don't want brings that feeling, only much better!

Confession

Child: Create in me a clean heart, O God.

Family Responds: **And renew a right spirit within me.**

Ask God to show you any ways you are in need of his forgiveness. Is there anyone you need to forgive?

Choose one person to add a small thorn to continue making the Crown of Thorns.

Pray Together: Dear Father, we remember that Jesus bore the pain of our sins on the cross. Thank you for the forgiveness that is ours because of what he was willing to do for us.

Say to each person, "The Peace of the Lord be with you!"

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Additional Activities for this Week

Family Activity - Lenten Prayer Corner

This week, create a special place in your home where family members can go to pray, think, read or just sit in God's presence during the last two weeks of Lent, and especially during Holy Week.

Create your space with cushions or perhaps a chair by a sunny window. Cover a small table with purple cloth and place a bible or bible story books on it. Children could draw pictures from some of the stories you have been reading together to put on the walls. Have a journal for children to draw or write in, or a basket with paper and a pencil for them to write prayer requests...perhaps you have other ideas.

Encourage each other to spend a little time in your prayer corner each day.

Reaching Out Project - Neighbors

What would be a kindness you could extend to neighbors this week? Invite someone to a Holy Week or Easter Service? Take a basket of cookies, or an Easter card to someone? Extend an invitation to dinner?

Talking About the Stories This Week

...some possible questions:

- ❖ Who are the people in this story?
- ❖ Is there a problem for the people? If so, what is it?
- ❖ Why did Jesus do what he did? Is there more than one reason?
- ❖ What is the most important thing that happens in the story?
- ❖ Is there more than one reaction to what Jesus did?
- ❖ How do you think you would have responded if you had been there?

FAMILY DEVOTIONS FOR HOLY WEEK

While the entire span of Jesus' thirty-three years on earth, from birth to death, is covered in the gospels, a third of the gospels are devoted to the events of *one week* of his life. In the case of John's gospel, it is one half! That week is of course the week that led to his death. May we know the life and presence of Jesus with us as we walk through these events this week in our homes and together as a church.

Take some time this weekend to plan some simple meals ahead of time and clear the family calendar as much as possible so that your family is free to participate in Holy Week services for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, The Great Vigil of Easter and of course, Easter Sunday morning!

There is a separate page of devotions for each day this week. We will be lighting one less candle each evening, ending in darkness on Good Friday.

One way to engage everyone with the story is to encourage every member of the family to think of a question about the reading. There are quite a few advantages to this approach: It provides an incentive to listen well. It means that the discussion, whether it is long and involved or short, is based on what seems important to those present (or maybe even what the Spirit is highlighting for you!). It demonstrates to children that asking questions of the scriptures is important for the discovery of their meaning. Children feel that they are contributors and co-learners, not simply recipients. Finally, everyone can participate at their own level!

PALM SUNDAY

Light the Candles

Today you will light all the candles except the one on the black circle. Each day as we go through Holy Week, light one fewer, working backwards around the circle from the green Palm Sunday candle. On Good Friday, you will light the last candle on a red circle. Saturday will be dark to represent Jesus in the tomb.

Child: Blessed is he who comes in the Name of the Lord.

Family Responds: **Hosanna in the highest!**

For older children: All four of the gospel writers include Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. If you have time, you could read them all! Do you notice any differences in the way the authors tell the story?

Family Activity – Palm Crosses

- If you brought home a palm branch from church yesterday, look on YouTube for instructions on how to fold a palm cross.
- Go as a family to each bedroom and tuck a palm cross into the top of the light switch plate. Pray for God's protection and blessing for the person who sleeps there. (If you don't have a palm cross, you could draw one, or make one from two twigs tied together with thread.)

TUESDAY

Light the Candles

This week we are lighting one fewer candle each day to show increasing darkness as Jesus got nearer to his death. Today, light only 4 candles on the red circles.

Child: Create in me a clean heart, O God

Family Responds: **and renew a right spirit within me.**

Confession

In the peace of evening, we come to you Lord God. May your love and mercy free our hearts from the cares of this day. Forgive us for those things we should not have done and for those things we failed to do. As we receive your forgiveness, may we too forgive our brothers and sisters who have injured us. We ask this in your name, Jesus, Amen. *Offer each other the Peace of Christ*

Worship in Song

Were You There? vs.2 – Were you there when they nailed him to the tree?

Tell God's Story – Jesus Anointed - Matthew 26:6-13

Pray a Blessing

God our Father, you have been our guide and our help throughout this day. Stay with us now throughout the night. May you enlighten and purify our hearts and keep them vigilant in faith, through Jesus, the Christ, our Lord. May Christ, the only Son of God, bless us and help us. Amen.

OPTIONAL: Family Activity - Anointing Oil

**from Celebrating Saints and Seasons – Jeanne Hunt*

- Put some fragrant oil (baby oil or bath oil) in a small container.
- Prayer of blessing: Dear Lord, your words are true: the story of the woman who anointed you out of love is still told today. Bless this ordinary oil for us and may it be a sign of your healing presence.
- Ask everyone to take a small amount of oil and make the sign of the cross on the palm of the person next to them.

WEDNESDAY

Light the Candles

Light three red candles this evening.

Child: Create in me a clean heart, O God

Family Responds: **and renew a right spirit within me.**

Confession

In the peace of evening, we come to you Lord God. May your love and mercy free our hearts from the cares of this day. Forgive us for those things we should not have done and for those things we failed to do. As we receive your forgiveness, may we too forgive our brothers and sisters who have injured us. Family Activity - Planning an Easter Egg Hunt

How about planning an Easter Egg hunt for children in your neighborhood? You could decorate invitations and deliver them together, inviting people to your house or yard on Sunday afternoon. Draw a cross on your candle with the marker. Have an adult carve out the design. Place a clove at each of the points of your cross and one in the middle. These represent the wounds in Jesus head, hands, feet and side.
