
Praying with beads has been a discipline I have returned to for a several years now. I would commend it to you for many reasons. As we inhabit bodies, it has been good for me to take prayer out of lofty intangible thoughts and anchor them in my hands. I am very aware of time and I have been blessed by the sense of starting and finishing that going around a prayer loop grants. Lent draws us ever deeper to the significance of the cross, and as these prayers start and end at the cross, I literally get to hold onto this hope. If you have the opportunity to read these prayers with others, perhaps as a family, you will find that the text takes on a cadence, a lilting of the words which draws me to memorization and the beauty of community. This is my short list. I trust you will meet God's invitation for you, as ultimately prayer is time to be with him.

This year our Lenten journey will included memorizing Psalm 67 for a congregational recitation at the Easter Vigil. You will see these scriptures included and it is our hope that the repetition will aid in this effort. This practice is a washing of the word, may it inspire your prayers, and refresh your soul.

The form of these prayers is based on the book *Praying with Beads* by Doerr and Owens and uses collects from the Book of Common Prayer and ESV scriptures including Psalm 67, Psalm 51 and seasonal texts.



+ **Cross** - acknowledge God's presence with this phrase to begin

* Invitatory bead - pray the weekly collect

^ Cruciform beads - 4 large beads make a cross, these anchoring scriptures are said each time you reach a big bead

- **Weeks beads** - 28 small beads, soaking scripture to pray in repetition, a "washing of the word"

* Lord's prayer - as you go out of your circle (this is the same bead as the invitatory bead)

Tips for using beads with small children or variety:

- 1. Shorten the Phrases.
- 2. Condense the loop. Feel free to go only halfway around the circle and then say the Lord's Prayer and finish on the cross, for example.
- 3. Shake it up for more engagement. For example: use one section of "weeks beads" to say thanksgivings or to offer prayers of intercession.

Ash Wednesday

+ Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love.

*Almighty and everlasting God, you hate nothing you have made, and you forgive the sins of all who are penitent: Create and make in us new and contrite hearts, that we, worthily lamenting our sins and acknowledging our wretchedness, may obtain of you, the God of all mercy, perfect remission and forgiveness; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

^ The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise. Psalm 51:17

- Against you, you only, have I sinned. Psalm 51:4

+ The Lord is full of compassion and mercy. Come let us adore him.

Holy Week Monday

Amen.

Holy Week Tuesday
